

72% of respondents found the workshops to be helpful for their current employment or for a future job




In an open ended response, 13 out of 23 respondents said the most relevant and interesting part was **the farm tour**.

"I think aquaculture is an innovative and sustainably viable way of growing food.


This job was my trial run to see if I wanted to work in aquaculture. And I loved it. It's fun, I get to be outside and on a boat. I think scallops are cute and interesting.
